They were part of an original group of six inseparable teenagers in the summer of 2003, with motherless, reckless Kala Lannan at its white-hot centre. Later that year, Kala disappeared without a trace, leaving her friends to grow up in the long shadow of her absence. Bought at a five-way auction and tipped to be one of the biggest debuts of the year, *Kala* is a brilliant novel about the sometimes brutal costs of belonging, as well as the battle between vengeance and forgiveness, despair and redemption.


Dublin's twenty bridges cross the tidal section of the River Liffey flowing through its centre; they were built over a span of a thousand years. Each has made a contribution to the city's development over time, so much so that it is possible to piece together its history by tracing their construction in chronological order.
