Patrick Flanery

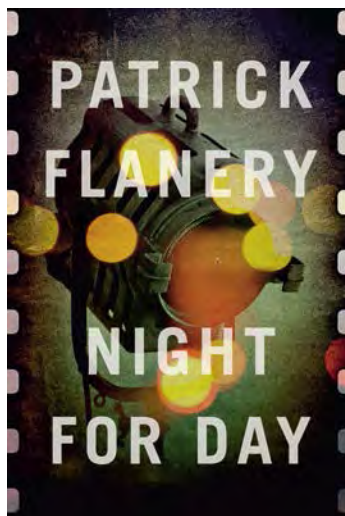
Expansive in scope and yet tenderly intimate, *Night for Day* is a fever-dream of a novel from a literary tour de force.

In McCarthy-era Hollywood, over the course of a single day, two friends grapple with the moral and professional uncertainties of the escalating Communist witch-hunt. One races to convince his actress wife not to turn informant for the House Committee on Un-American Activities, while the other – a leftist screenwriter – confronts the fear of being blacklisted. As they flee into the backlots and slip in and out of strange, shifting film sets, they come to terms with the subtleties of belonging and the enormity of exile. *Night for Day* conjures a feverish vision of America gripped by insanity.

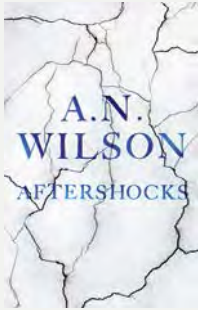

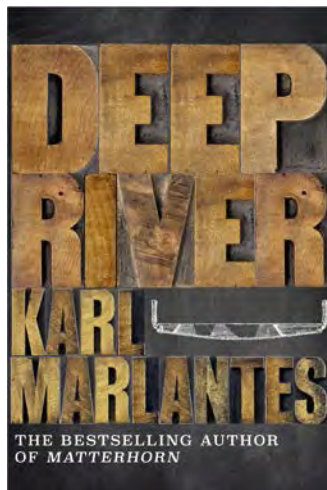

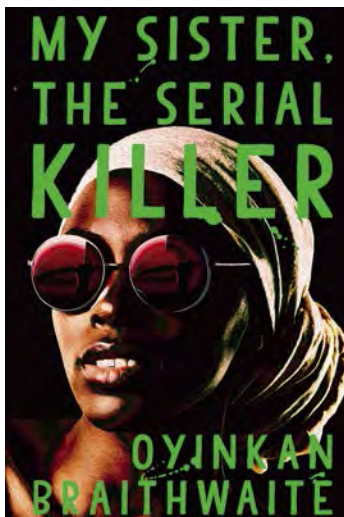
My Sister, the Serial Killer

Fifty Years On

From Barricades to Brexit: What's Wrong with Northern Ireland?

Malachi O'Doherty

An evocative memoir that explores the Troubles in Northern Ireland and their legacy, published to coincide with the 50th anniversary of the beginning of the violence.

August 2019 marks the 50th anniversary of an eruption of armed violence that traumatized Northern Ireland and transformed a period of street protests over civil rights into decades of paramilitary warfare by republicans and loyalists.

Looking back over the past 50 years, Malachi O'Doherty recounts his experiences of living through the Troubles and compares and contrasts an era that produced violent trauma with Northern Ireland today, which experiences more street protests than in the past and has a reformed policing culture, yet has a stalled politics, Brexit looming and is going through a demographic change that will do away with the Protestant majority.
