
Sourdough

Joanna now lives in Copenhagen under daily threat from ISIS supporters, as she continues her fight for women's rights off the front line.



Joanna Palani played a variety of roles for the YPJ – the female battalion of the Syrian Kurdish group YPG – the Peshmerga and as part of coalition forces, including the SDF, supported by US and UK special forces. Her last position in the YPJ was in a sniper unit.
